Rod was appointed City Controller in 2003. In 2008, the City Controller's Office assumed responsibility for the City's personnel and emergency management functions, and he became the City Controller & Director of Human Resources. In 2017, the department acquired the City's revenue and treasury responsibilities and was renamed Administrative Services.

Rod has nearly 30 years of municipal finance experience. Prior to working for Whittier, Rod was the Assistant Finance Director and Interim Finance Director with the City of Redlands, overseeing their Accounting & Budget, Purchasing, Risk Management, Information Technology and Fleet divisions. Rod has also worked for the cities of Anaheim and Brea, along with the Orange County Sheriff's Department.

As the Director of Administrative Services, Rod is responsible for the City's Accounting & Budget, Human Resources, Risk & Emergency Management, and Revenue (Treasury) divisions. Duties include oversight of the City's general ledger, budget, audit, purchasing, accounts payable-receivable, recruiting, labor negotiations, contract administration, payroll, benefit management, Personnel Board, worker's compensation, general liability, property insurance, disaster preparedness, emergency operations, cashiering, business license, animal control, investment and banking. Rod also serves as the Deputy Director of the City's Emergency Operations Center and as a Board Member for both the California Insurance Pool Authority and the Los Angeles County Area E Disaster Management Authority.

Rod holds a Master of Public Administration degree with an emphasis in Emergency Management from Anna Maria College, a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from the University of La Verne, and an Associate of Arts degree with an emphasis in accounting from Golden West College. Rod has earned certificates in Governmental Accounting and Budget from the University of California, and Governmental Emergency Management from Auburn University.

Lastly, Rod is certified by the California Office of Emergency Services as an Emergency Management Specialist and is a member of the California Society of Municipal Finance Officers (CSMFO), California Municipal Treasurers Association (CMTA), Governmental Finance Officers Association (GFOA), Association of Certified Fraud Examiners (ACFE), International Personnel Management Association, International Association of Emergency Managers, and California Emergency Services Association.
