Mineral Extraction Permit Administration Subcommittee

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended the City Council extend the sunset date of the Mineral Extraction Permit Administration Subcommittee through June 2015.

BACKGROUND

On May 13, 2014, the City Council considered assignments to local government associate organizations and Council subcommittees, as is the regular practice following each election. The Council also reviewed the City Council's Subcommittee list, considered changes in those appointments, and extended terms of some subcommittees based on the status of its project. The Council formed a new Uptown Bond Projects Subcommittee to provide interim direction on disposition of the portion of \$25,900,000 in bond proceeds from the former Whittier Redevelopment Agency intended for expenditure in the Uptown Specific Plan area. The City Council deferred consideration of the Mineral Extraction Permit Administration Subcommittee to a subsequent meeting.
