I am aware that this street is busy, but in the 28 years I have lived in my home, this has been the worst as it seems the city is treating Norwalk Blvd. as a highway. The city has already implemented this on Beverly Blvd. and should do so on Norwalk Blvd. as there is no reason for heavily weighted trucks to take detours/permanent route through our street. I hope the city is willing to work with the residents before it becomes litigious.
