RE: <u>SB 923 (Archuleta) Theft.</u> Letter of SUPPORT (Introduced January 11, 2024)

Dear Senator Archuleta:

As Mayor of the City of Whittier, I am writing to express our strong support for Senate Bill (SB) 923, which would revise the definition of shoplifting to require an intent to steal retail property or merchandise and would require a person convicted of petty theft or shoplifting, if the person has 2 or more prior convictions for specified theft-related offenses, to be punished by imprisonment in the county jail.

This legislation is an important step toward rectifying the unintended consequences of the voter-approved Proposition 47, since it addresses the pressing issue of theft within our community and provides much-needed measures to protect our residents and businesses. The City of Whittier has unfortunately experienced an increase in theft incidents in recent years, causing concern among our residents and local businesses. Compared to 2022, the City has experienced a 43% increase in reported commercial burglaries and an 11% increase in reported shoplifting as of August 31, 2023.

SB 923, with its comprehensive approach to addressing theft-related challenges, aligns with our City's commitment to ensuring the safety and well-being of our community members by deterring individuals from engaging in repeated theft-related offenses by holding them accountable for their actions through jail time. The bill's focus on individuals with two or more prior convictions for specified theft-related offenses acknowledges the issue of recidivism. By imposing more severe consequences for repeat offenders, the legislation aims to address and potentially reduce the cycle of criminal behavior.
