




The City of Whittier is proud to be a member of Clean Power Alliance!

How does it work?

Starting February 1, 2019, you will be automatically enrolled in **Clean Power** which provides 50% renewable energy content and the opportunity to support building a cleaner future, all at cost-competitive rates.

Clean Power Alliance purchases clean power and Southern California Edison (SCE) delivers it. **Nothing else changes**—SCE will continue to deliver power to your home, send just one bill, be responsible for resolving any issues with your electricity service, and qualified customers will continue to have access to financial assistance, rebates, and incentives.

You can change your service at any time by selecting one of Clean Power Alliance's other two rate options: 100% Green Power, which provides 100% renewable energy content and gives customers the opportunity to be an environmental champion, and Lean Power, which provides 36% renewable energy content at the lowest possible cost—with the added benefit of local management and control.
