MINUTES CITY OF WHITTIER SOCIAL SERVICES COMMISSION REGULAR MEETING CITY COUNCIL CHAMBERS, 13230 PENN STREET TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 2018 – 6:30 P.M.

1. CALL TO ORDER

The Social Services Commission of the City of Whittier met in Regular Session in the Whittier City Hall Council Chambers, 13230 Penn Street, Whittier, California. Chair Enriquez-Santos called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Vice Chair Luevano led the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States flag.

4. PUBLIC COMMENTS

None

5. STAFF REPORTS

5. A APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

It was moved by Vice Chair Luevano, seconded by Commissioner McDonnell, and carried 5-0 to approve the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of October 2, 2018 as presented.

5. B WHITTIER VOLUNTEER RECOGNITION PROGRAM

Secretary Alaniz reported that preparations for the November 13, 2018 Volunteer Recognition event are proceeding. He asked Commissioners to meet in the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department office at 4:45 p.m. on the 13th to go over any last minute details. Commission reviewed the draft program schedule and biographies for each award recipient. Commission requested staff include phonetic

pronunciations for the recipients be included on the scripts. Commissioner Illingworth noted that he would be unable to attend the event due to a prior commitment. Commissioner Barrett will present one of the awards that Commissioner Illingworth was to present, and Vice Chair Luevano will present the other. Staff to adjust biography scripts to reflect the changes. Secretary Alaniz reported that the event might not be video recorded, as in past years, due to the City's Videographer, John Garside, leaving his position with the City. Chair Enriquez-Santos suggested contacting Whittier College for possible assistance with recording the event, as they have a "top notch" program and students willing and able to assist with these types of projects. Secretary Alaniz noted that the event must conclude by 6:00 p.m. to allow City Council to begin their meeting on time.

It was moved by Commissioner Illingworth, seconded by Vice Chair Luevano, and carried 5-0 to receive and file update on the Whittier Volunteer Recognition Program.

5. C UPDATE ON CITY OF WHITTIER HOMELESS PLAN IMPLEMENTATION

Commissioner Barrett requested direction on how and when Commission is to update City Council on implementation progress. Community Services Manager, Martin Browne, presented an update on implementation of the Homeless Plan. He noted that on October 23, 2018 the City Council received a staff report seeking direction for project ideas for two grants available from Los Angeles County's Measure H fund. Mr. Browne stated that the grant application deadline is 3:00 p.m. on Wednesday, November 7, 2018. Response to the applications is expected in early December. One grant of \$300,000, with no matching funds required, is for Priority Area 1, which is for increasing the housing supply. This will pay for hotel/motel vouchers and subleasing homes. He noted that staff is working with First Day to shorten their housing waiting list, and with the Whittier Police Department to help get people out of the parks and off the streets. Chair Enriquez-Santos voiced her concerns about the possibly "substandard" conditions of some of the motels in Whittier. Commissioner Barrett noted that the cold weather shelters also had issues with local hotels and motels, including drug problems on the properties. Commissioner McDonnell had questions about the long-term plan for the people moving from the First Day program to hotels/motels. Will they be prepared, and have a place to move to more permanently? She also questioned the age range for "transitional age" youth. Mr. Browne noted that the age range is 18-24 years old. Commissioner Barrett guestioned the status of Whittier College and Rio Hondo College students dealing with homelessness. Mr. Browne reported that there are approximately 2,500 in unstable living situations. He noted that there are grants available for immediate action through the "Housing Trust", however there is too much money needed to sustain it. Mr. Browne reported that the second Measure H fund grant for a possible \$300,000 requires a \$250,000 match in funds spent or "in-kind" services. This is for Priority Area 2, for completing Homeless Plan objectives. This is an 18-month grant for the period of January 2019-June 2020 and will allow hiring of two part-time staff members to assist with implementation of the Homeless Plan. The City will be working with Jovenes, Inc., The Whole Child, and Whittier First Day on administering the home sub-leasing program.

Mr. Browne noted that the City Council recently adopted a Resolution in support of the United Way "Everyone In" program.

Vice Chair Luevano questioned whether the grants would affect the Social Services funding program. Secretary Alaniz stated that there would be no impact to the budget for now. The Social Services funding will actually help implementation of the Homeless Plan by adding to the required matching funds requirement. Commissioner Barrett noted that City Council would once again provide direction for the funding program.

Mr. Browne reported that he continues to meet monthly with a group of cities as a "case management group". They discuss specific individuals, as well as LA HOP referrals. He also stated that the number of people staying in Parnell Park has been reduced. Commissioner McDonnell encouraged documentation of these meetings and tracking of the individuals. Vice Chair Luevano suggested including some of the people's stories when reporting to City Council. Mr. Browne noted that at this time LA HOP does not have a good accounting/records system in place. Commissioner Barrett encouraged staff to continue to support this program. Mr. Browne reported that there are currently 600 street engagement staff members, and they hope to increase the number to 1,000.

It was moved by Commissioner McDonnell, seconded by Vice Chair Luevano, and carried 5-0 to receive and file update on the City of Whittier Homeless Plan Implementation.

6. SECRETARY COMMENTS

Secretary Alaniz, reported that he had received letters from the Whittier Area Literacy Council and Children's Dental thanking the City for the Social Services funding they had received. Commissioner McDonnell suggested sending the letters to the City Council as well.

Secretary Alaniz also reported on the following coming events:

- Veteran's Day will be observed with a program on Saturday, November 10 at 9:00 a.m., in front of Whittier City Hall.
- The Social Services Volunteer recognition program will take place on Tuesday, November 13 at 5:30 p.m. in front of Whittier City Hall. He asked that Commissioners please meet in the Parks, Recreation and Community Services office at 4:45 p.m. to go over any last minute details.
- The W Fine Art Show will be held on Friday, November 16 from 6:00 p.m. 9:00 p.m., and Saturday, November 17 from 10:00 a.m. 6:00 p.m. at the Parnell Park Community Center. This is a free family event. In conjunction with the W, there will be a "Chalktastic" Student Sidewalk Chalk Art Contest, on Saturday, November 17 from 10:30 a.m. 2:00 p.m.

7. COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS

Vice Chair Luevano reported that he had attended the recent Consortium on Homelessness community meeting. He noted that it was a good event and that it is helpful to see other pieces of the puzzle.

Commissioner Illingworth commended the City Council and staff on the work done on the Homeless Plan.

Commissioner McDonnell reported that she had participated in the recent Spooktacular 5K. She noted it is a great event that promotes health and family participation.

Commissioner Barrett thanked Mr. Browne for his work on implementation of the Whittier Homeless Plan, and noted that exciting things are moving along. She also reported that she had read an article on Facebook about a town that declared the opioid issue in their city a "disaster" to move it to their top priority. She suggested Whittier follow their lead to make homelessness a priority.

There being no further business, Chair Enriquez-Santos adjourned the meeting at 7:10 p.m.
